During the year the Beavers have worked on several Challenge Awards and Activity Badges.

The start of the Summer Term was the St George's Day event which went very well and we renewed our Beaver Promise. A Brixworth fire engine came to the Sportsfield for everyone to have a look at and talk to the, firefighters which was enjoyable. The Beavers gained the Photographers badge by taking photos of different objects to spell 'Beavers' We took the Beavers to visit Pitsford Church ahead of the Remembrance Day Parade, they found the Church very interesting. Thank you to Oscar for carrying the flag for the Parade so well.

We all had great fun at the Christmas Fayre and ended our term with a Christmas Party at the Village Hall when Father Christmas came to visit.

In the Spring Term we continued with the International Badge and My World Challenge Award by celebrating the Chinese New Year, Burns night and learning about Georgina's forthcoming trip to Uganda .The Beavers were asked to fill a match box with as many small items as they could and to be sponsored for each item. This raised £55.00 which was great. The Beavers also wrote letters for Georgina to take to Outspan School. We made mini pancakes and decorated them, celebrated World Book day and made models out of junk recycling materials for the builders badge .We also joined Holcot and Walgrave Beaver Colony for a 'Drive Through Movie' afternoon where the Beavers designed and made some amazing car creations, then the Beavers sat in them with some popcorn to watch a movie.

We ended the term with an Easter egg hunt which is always fun around the quarry.

In the Spring Term we celebrated World Book Day and Chinese New Year, played an amazing night of Human Hungry Hippos and learnt about the Green Cross Code. We had a night learning about our connection with Outspan School in Uganda and wrote letters to the school children which Georgina took with her in March and brought back letters of replies for us. In February, we had a Cub day at John Lowther Activity Centre, where we had fun on the challenge course, practised our fire lighting skills and made ice cream cone s 'mores. In the Autumn term the Scouts visited the Wellingborough and District food bank, taking donations from all sections with us, learning about what they do and helping make up food parcels for people to collect. The Scouts covered map reading and compass skills. The Remembrance Parade and service was well represented which is always a pleasure to see. Georgina and Rebecca came to talk to the Scouts about the connection we have with Outspan School Bwaise Uganda, we wrote letters for Georgina to take to the School .We had an evening at Overstone Scout Ground where we did some fire lighting and cooked cowboy stew.

In the Spring Term the Scouts did some model making using florist wire, making Mexican tin art and we have had several visits from our local PCSO and Police Officer, learning about their different uniforms and the work they might do each day. We held a Ready Steady Cook night which is always good fun and we have had several problem solving games .The Scouts also have been learning about navigation, and orienteering and went on a hike from Pitsford to Moulton

During the year the Scouts have received their Creative Challenge, World Challenge, Skills challenge Outdoor Challenge Awards and 4 Scouts completed their Expedition Challenge Awards along with their D of E Bronze Expedition.

GROUP TREASURER'S REPORT

When I prepared my report for the AGM 12 months ago as Scouting had just about returned to normal after the pandemic I was looking forward to a rather busier 2022/23. Always be careful what you wish for! It has been a busy year with camps, activities and subscriptions keeping your Treasurer on his toes and judging by the activity in recent weeks the year ahead promises more of the same.

Where is Pitsford Scout Group financially? I am pleased to say that the recovery that I predicted in my last report has continued and we are close to being able to replenish our reserves in order to get those back to pre-pandemic levels. Our aim has always been to have sufficient reserves to pay two year's Capitation – the contribution that the Group has to pay to District, County and Headquarters which in March 2023 totalled £3190.00 equivalent to £58.00 per head – and I anticipate that we will be able to return our reserves to that level in the next few months. The value of having such reserves was only too apparent during the pandemic when our income was much reduced but we continued to be able to meet all our outgoings.

What does this mean for the parents? I think that I can safely say that we will not be looking to increase subscriptions in the next 12 months. Thank you to all those who pay promptly and save us the trouble of having to send out reminders. Thank you also to all those who have completed Gift Aid forms as the Gift Aid that we can then claim from HMRC is an invaluable addition to the Group's income.

What lies ahead? I have no doubt that the Leaders will be planning more activities and camps which will keep your Treasurer busy in the months to come. That may well mean that you receive requests for more payments but I am sure that in terms of value for money the experiences that your young people get in Scouting are second to none.

Finally my thanks to James Bellamy for his help with the Accounts.
